# 10 Legitimately Fun Things You Can Do In Arizona Without Spending A Dime

Have any fun plans you're looking forward to this weekend, next weekend, or even next month? All of this <u>fun stuff in Arizona</u> is totally free; you just need to make sure to plan in advance for your visit. You won't regret it!

## 1. Hiking and nature walks.

Most museums around the state sponsor free admission days! For example, the Phoenix Art Museum is admission-free on First Fridays, or on Wednesday afternoons (for basic admission - special exhibits require a ticket still). Meanwhile, places like the Tempe History Museum and the Pioneer Museum in Flagstaff are always free (but make sure to double-check their websites for most up-to-date hours and closure information).





# 3. Check out a replica ghost town at Goldfield.

# 4. ...or, visit the real thing!

Visiting a real ghost town is free as well! One suggestion is <u>Fairbank</u>, in southeastern Arizona, where you can see some old buildings still standing to remind you of a time that now seems so far away. It was first settled in 1881!



# 5. Take a hike to see some very old ruins.

Places like <u>Canyon De Chelly</u> and Sycamore Canyon have well-preserved ruins that you can visit for free. Just remember when visiting to be respectful of the people who once lived there and the history they left behind: stay on designated paths, do not leave graffiti, and do not take anything from the area. Look, don't touch - and keep it amazing for generations to come. Make sure to double-check their websites for the most up-to-date hours and closure information while planning your trip.

# Here are 16 Awesome Things You Can Do In Arizona... Without Opening Your Wallet

If you're waiting for payday to arrive but don't want to spend another day at home, here are a few free activities that we recommend checking out across the state.

Please note, Arizona Capitol Museum and Show Low Museum are temporarily closed.

1. African American Multicultural Museum, Scottsdale

Visit this small museum for free in the afternoons on Thursdays, Fridays, and Saturdays. They regularly change their exhibits, which focus on art and history.

# 2. Arizona Capitol Museum, Phoenix

Get some insight on our state's history by booking a free tour at the museum housed in the Capitol Building. Also, parking at Wesley Bolin Plaza is free so you can save a few more dollars by parking nearby.

# 3. Arizona Military Museum, Phoenix

Located inside an adobe building at the Papago Park Military Reservation, this free museum hosts exhibits that focus on the wide ranging military presence in Arizona. They are open on weekends from 1:00pm to 4:00pm.

### 4. Browse a farmers' market

Farmers markets are gaining popularity across the state. Not only are they great places to find locally grown produce but you can also browse items made by local artisans and eat free food samples.

# 5. Drive (or walk) through historic neighborhoods
