2013 GEICO Business Student Scholars Receive \$2,000 in Scholarships

Jackson, MS – After being addicted to drugs, losing her son and finding herself homeless, Valerie Le Grande dedicated herself to getting clean and sober and returning to college. Now she is one of two recipients of Phi Theta Kappa's \$1,000 GEICO Business Student Scholarships.

A business administration major at Mesa Community College in Arizona, Le Grande earned a 4.0 grade point average, and she plans to continue her education at Arizona State University. In addition to serving as the Public Relations Officer for her local Omicron Beta Chapter of Phi Theta Kappa, she received the President's Service Award for logging more than 8,000 hours of community service. Le Grande has also regained custody of her son and settled into a home with him.

The second GEICO Business Student Scholarship recipient for 2013 is Martin Carr, a business administration major at Paul D. Camp Community College in Virginia. A single father, he also maintained a 4.0 grade point average and served as President of his local Phi Theta Kappa Chapter. In addition Carr served as a representative of the college at the Franklin-Southampton Area Chamber of Commerce Legislative Breakfast and is a student representative on the President's Advisory Council at Paul D. Camp. He plans to pursue bachelor's and master's degrees in accounting from Old Dominion University.

the completion of associate degrees. A sponsor of the Phi Theta Kappa Annual Convention, GEICO has given more than \$1 million to support scholarships for Phi Theta Kappa members.
