RE: Fall 2021 Semester Start - 2022-1 Paramedic Cohort

Interested Paramedic Education Program Applicants:

The Mesa Community College Department of EMS & Fire Sciences is currently accepting applications for the 2022-1 Paramedic Education Program Cohort. This Cohort is open to both limited experience providers with less than two years experience as an EMCT and experienced providers with over two years experience as an EMCT. Those applicants with less than two years verifiable work history as an EMCT are required to complete the pre-paramedic foundational coursework prior to competing in the selection process (see attached pre-paramedic course list). Please review this packet in its entirety if you are interested in applying.

- This program is scheduled to begin in the Fall Semester 2021 (Wednesday, August 25<sup>th</sup> 2021) and conclude at the end of the Summer Session 2021 (Thursday, August 18<sup>th</sup> 2022). Graduation is tentatively scheduled for Saturday, August 20<sup>th</sup> 2022.
- This program is a three block (3 semester) program, lasting approximately twelve calendar months (actual time in class is approximately 11 months after accounting for all college observed breaks).
- This program observes all college designated holidays and semester breaks.
- This program is eligible for federal and private financial aid and VA benefits. (please contact the MCC financial aid and VA department representatives for further requirements and information on how to apply for benefits)
- This program is designed for applicants interested in obtaining their National Registry Paramedic Certification and pursuing their CCL in Paramedicine and their AAS degree in Paramedicine.
- This program is designed for working adults with both limited EMCT experience and significant EMCT experience in a first responder EMS/Fire based environment.
- This program is a competency based program designed after the 2011 National EMS Education Standards and the 2015 American Heart Association ECC guidelines.
- This program consists of approximately 650 hours of didactic classroom & laboratory participation, 200 hours of clinical internship participation and 450 hours of EMS field internship participation. The total program time commitment requirement not including study and preparatory time is approximately 1,300 hours.

Acceptance into the Paramedic Education Program requires successful completion of a competitive selection process, at a minimum this will consist of completed online program application with short answer questions, computer based general EMT knowledge entrance examination and an oral panel interview. Please note that applicants that are employed by current municipal, authority and district fire service agencies that participate in the Phoenix-Mesa Regional Automatic Aid System and are active members of the EMS ROCC, are not required to participate in the selection process. In order to bypass the Mesa Community College selection process, fire service/ EMS candidates must have been previously selected by a competitive departmental process to establish eligibility and must be ranked on a current eligibility list to attend Paramedic Training. Mesa Community College reserves the right to further evaluate all applicants on an “as needed” basis. Applicants participating in the Mesa Community College Paramedicine student selection process will be ranked in order of performance from 1-

24. Successful applicants will be included in the Paramedic Education Program Cohort 2022-1, scheduled to begin with Block #1 in the Fall Semester 2021. A maximum of 24 students will be accepted. **Once accepted into the program, all students must successfully pass a DPS level one fingerprint clearance background check, additional Castle Branch comprehensive background check, annual physical examination and a randomized urine drug screen. If a student has any noted criminal history or fails further screening processes, students will be at risk of not meeting clinical/field internship compliance requirements. Failure to meet the required compliance requirements may result in a student's immediate dismissal from the program.**

All core Paramedic Program educational blocks 1-3 (semesters) classroom didactic & laboratory sessions will be offered on Wednesday's and Thursday's weekly from 0900-1800 hours each day, students must attend two (2), eight (8) hour classroom sessions per week (must attend both Wednesday and Thursday class sessions). Clinical and vehicular/field internships will be developed in a varying schedule format in order to facilitate the diverse nature and availability of hospital and field internship shifts and sponsoring agencies. **It is important to note, that students are required to attend classroom sessions and clinical and vehicular/field internships simultaneously and at times, can require up to 24+ hours a week of time allocation for school which does not include prep time or studying.**

Due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, this program cohort will be delivered in a hybrid online/in-person format for all didactic and laboratory session. Most, if not all theory/didactic content will be delivered in the online virtual modality. Laboratory sessions will be held at the Mesa Community College Downtown Center campus located at 145 North Centennial Way, 4th Floor, Mesa, AZ 85201. Clinical and field internships and some special laboratory sessions may be held at off-campus sites. **Requirements for admission into Block #1 Paramedic Program:  
(requirements must be met prior to acceptance into Block #1)**

- ✓ If less you have less than two (2) years verifiable experience as an EMCT in a first responder environment, you must provide proof (transcripts) of successful completion of the pre-paramedic foundational coursework (PME190, PME191)
- ✓ If you have more than two (2) years verifiable experience as an EMCT in a first responder environment, you must provide proof of that experience. A letter from your employer(s) on their agency letterhead validating your employment dates and experience shall serve as acceptable verification.
- ✓ Must possess a current Healthcare Provider level CPR card reflective of the 2015 ECC Guidelines for BLS Resuscitation. (AHA and ASHI only)
- ✓ Must possess a current/valid State of Arizona EMCT certification
- ✓ Submit unofficial college transcripts.
- ✓ DPS (Arizona Department of Public Safety) fingerprint clearance card. A receipt of payment and verification of submission will be accepted with application until a permanent fingerprint ID card is received. In addition to the DPS fingerprint clearance card, accepted students must clear an additional background check done via Castle Branch. This will be obtained after acceptance.
- ✓ Proof of immunity to Measles, Mumps, Rubella, seasonal influenza “flu” vaccine, and other immunizations as required by our contracted clinical/field internship sites. Reasonable time limits will be given to complete this requirement as needed. It is usually easiest to have your Primary Care Provider (PCP) perform a blood draw and check your titers for all immunizations. (Submittal of a recent titer showing “immunity” will be accepted)
- ✓ Immunity to Varicella (Chicken Pox) (Submittal of a recent titer showing “immunity” will be accepted)
- ✓ Proof of Hepatitis B immunity (Submittal of a recent titer showing “immunity” will be accepted) or evidence that you have declined the vaccination series
- ✓ **Negative TB skin test or Chest X-ray within 6 months prior to application deadline. The TB test used must be a two-step process.**
- ✓ Verification/documentation of an annual physical exam (use form contained in application packet).
- ✓ 24 Hour Hazardous Materials First Responder (HAZWOPR) or higher.
- ✓ Completion of the Pre-Paramedic Foundational Coursework of PME190, PME191 (or equivalent field/work experience as determined by the Paramedic Program Director)
- ✓ Successfully complete the computer-based entrance examination consisting of general EMT knowledge, (MINIMUM SCORE OF 81% IS REQUIRED TO MOVE ON TO THE ORAL PANEL INTERVIEW)
- ✓ Successful completion of an oral panel interview process
- ✓ Negative drug screen as required by our contracted clinical/field internship sites (typically a 12-14 panel drug screen) The typical 12-14 panel drug screen includes: amphetamines, methamphetamines, barbiturates, benzodiazepines, cannabinoids, cocaine metabolite, methadone, meperidine, opiates, oxycodone, phencyclidine, propoxyphene. –Medical marijuana or religious hallucinogen use ARE NOT permitted.

**Applications Accepted:** Paramedic program applications may be submitted year round. However, students must complete the application and program selection process a minimum of 45 days prior to the schedule program start date of their preferred program cohort.

**\*Those applicants with less than two (2) years of verifiable work experience as an EMCT in a first responder environment must first complete the required pre-paramedic foundational coursework prior to program acceptance.**

\*\*A maximum of 24 students per assigned cohort will be accepted into the 2022-1 Paramedic Education Program Cohort.
