**Placement Testing:** You are allowed to retake placement tests under the following circumstances: Students will be permitted one-retest in English and Reading after a 24-hour waiting period. 2) ONE additional retest is permitted no sooner than three months from the oldest valid score date at any course placement testing site. Course placement scores, with the exception of the reading exemption scores, will be valid for two years from the date of the original or re-test assessment. ## READING PLACEMENTS

### **RDG 071**

Test results indicate that there is a gap between your reading level and the level needed to succeed in college classes. If you plan to take English 101, your reading skills should be at least equal to Reading 100. You should plan to enroll in Reading 071 this semester and continue taking a reading course until you complete Reading 100.

### **RDG 081**

Test results indicate that there is a gap between your reading level and the level needed to succeed in college classes. If you plan to take English 101, your reading skills should be at least equal to Reading 100. You should plan to enroll in Reading 081 this semester and continue taking a reading course until you complete Reading 100.

### **RDG 100/111/112/113**

Test results indicate that there is a gap between your reading level and the level needed to succeed in college classes. You should plan to enroll in any 100-level course in another content area. Please note that Reading 111, 112, and 113 are equivalent courses.

### **CRE 101**

Test results indicate that you are reading at the college grade level. You should plan to enroll in CRE 101. This class will help you develop and apply critical thinking skills through critically reading varied and challenging materials. Includes analysis, evaluation, interpretation, and synthesis through at least two substantial writing and/or speaking tasks. \*Prerequisites: A grade of "C" or better in Eng 101.

### **Reading Exempt**

Test results indicate that you are reading at college grade level. A Reading Exempt placement does not place you into or excuse you from English 101; please see your writing placement.

## WRITING PLACEMENTS

### **ENG 081**

Placement into ENG 081 is an opportunity for students to be introduced to the rhetorical nature of writing (context, audience, purpose) and the relationship between reading and writing. In addition, some focused attention to grammar and sentence usage will be given in correlation to students' writing samples. This class will prepare students for successful entry into ENG 091 and/or placmenet in the ALP.

### **ENG 091**

Placement into ENG 091 will be an opportunity for students to have a better understanding of the rhetorical nature of writing (context, audience, purpose) and the relationship between reading and writing. Beyond some contextual grammar instruction, students will learn how to incorporate outside sources into their own writing.

### **ENG 101**

Your writing score and reading level indicate that you are ready to take English 101. This class fulfills the English requirement for the Associate Degree and transfers to a four-year college.
