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# Cienega Cam Reveals World of Endangered Pupfish

The Red Mountain Campus is again partnering with the Arizona Game & Fish Department (AZGFD), this time to offer a view into the world of endangered fish and frogs that inhabit the campus cienega. From this created wetlands system, an underwater camera will be streaming to an AZGFD website the activities of a variety of native aquatic wildlife, including the endangered Desert Pupfish, Lowland Leopard Frogs and Gila Topminnows as well as the Long-Finned Dace and Sonoran Mud Turtles.

Dedicated to sustainability and the environment, the Red Mountain Campus has been an important partner with AZGFD, U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service, the Phoenix Zoo and other conservation-minded organizations in protecting threatened wildlife species. The campus was recognized

with the 2016 Certified Wildlife Habitat designation from the National Wildlife Federation and 2014 Founders Conservation Award from the North American Native Plant Society.

In addition to being an elite ecology experience, the partnership activities with government and private groups allow students to interact with wildlife professionals and see careers in science in action.

## Submit Your FAFSA Application Now for Fall 2017!

The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) determines scholarship, grant, loan and work-study eligibility. It can take up to six weeks or longer to be awarded and if you are not awarded financial aid by the time your tuition is due, you will need to sign up for a payment plan to avoid being dropped from your classes. ## Full-Time MCC College Advisors Move into Mesa High Schools

Beginning with the 2017-18 school year, six Mesa high schools each will have a designated, **full-time Mesa Community College advisor to assist students in preparing for their future education.** These college advisors will become an integral part of the high school culture by assisting students in earning college credits through early college programs; facilitating placement testing; developing career plans using the MPS Education and Career Action Plan (ECAP); guiding students through

the enrollment process; and assisting students in searching for scholarships and financial aid to pursue their educational goals at MCC and beyond.
