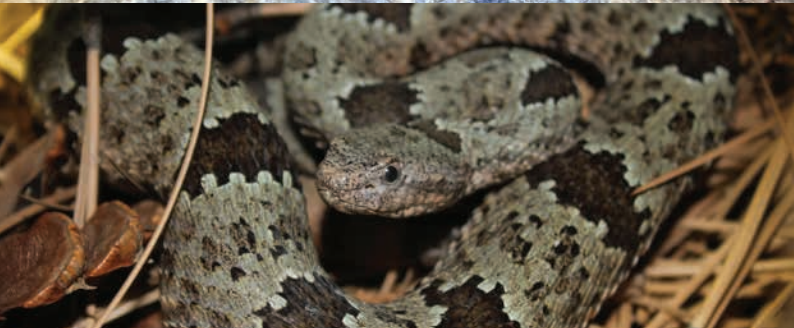

## Come Visit Where Desert Critters Dwell

The Saguaro building is a living laboratory featuring a huge terrarium in the lobby that invites up-close yet safe observations of Sonoran Desert wildlife including four species of rattlesnakes, nonvenomous snakes, a Gila monster and Sonoran Desert toad.

Two more terrariums are built into the walls with views from the hallway and classroom. One features mountain forest rattlesnakes and the other integrates a water system and plants creating a native frog and toad habitat. Science laboratories feature more animals including snakes, lizards, amphibians, arachnids and insects.

### Cienega Wildlife Refuge

In nature, spring-fed wetland systems are becoming rare. In a serene setting, the Cienega at Red Mountain is a refuge for endangered plants and critters including the desert pupfish, Gila topminnow and lowland leopard frogs.

## Mother Nature is a Member of the Faculty

Amid the 98 acres of our vibrant Sonoran Desert campus, Mother Nature serves as an instructor, classroom and learning habitat in the cienega located at the center of campus.

In the fall of 2014, 300 endangered, native desert pupfish were released by the Arizona Game and Fish Department (AZGFD) into a refuge pond in the cienega. Partners with the college in the effort included AZGFD, U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, the Phoenix Zoo and Nina Mason Pulliam Rio Salado Audubon Center.

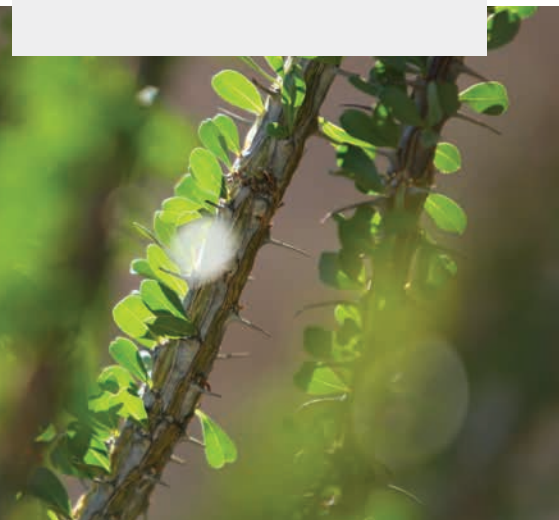
In summer 2016, through further collaboration with the Phoenix Zoo and AZGFD, our Cienega became home to 200 endangered Gila topminnows. They joined the protected lowland leopard frogs, which have bred successfully after being added to the refuge last year. The Cienega now includes two species of endangered fish, an endangered plant species and several other species of protected reptiles and amphibians.

In addition to being an elite ecology experience, the endangered fish release allowed students to interact with wildlife professionals and participate in activities that highlighted careers in science.



### Red Mountain Campus Receives National Conservation Recognitions

Mesa Community College at Red Mountain has been recognized with the North American Native Plant Society's (NANPS) 2014 Founders Conservation Award as well as the National Wildlife Federation's (NWF) 2016 Certified Wildlife Habitat designation as part of the wildlife group's Garden for Wildlife program.

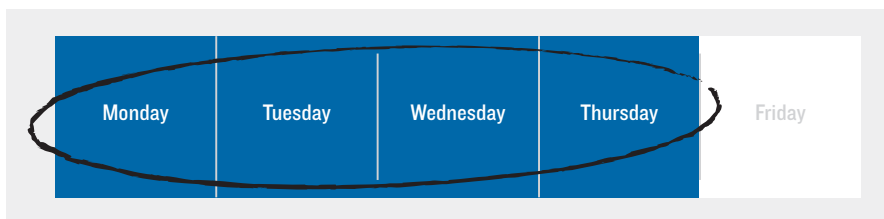
