The **Superstition Mountains** are the most incredible natural attraction in Mesa. We'd describe them as picture perfect. Covering a sprawling swatch of this wilderness is the alluring **Lost Dutchman State Park**. Named for a German prospector, or *Deutschman*, legend has it he struck it rich in a gold mine somewhere in the park. The exact location? A secret he took with him to the grave. To this day eager treasure hunters search the hills... but most just come to enjoy the park's hiking trails.

The **Riparian Preserve** at Water Ranch just outside of Mesa is a wildlife and landscape preservation area created from reused grey water.
