Quarantine

Please see Centers for Disease Control ([CDC travel guidelines](#)) to determine if and how long you should quarantine after your arrival to the US.

Travel Signatures

New Students

No travel signature is needed if you are arriving in the US for the first time, with an Initial Attendance I-20.

Continuing Students

If you are currently in your home country and planning to return in person for the Spring semester, or traveling outside the US during vacation, you can request a travel signature to reenter with the online form: [Travel Signature Request](#). Note that you must be registered full-time for Fall semester to be eligible for a travel signature.

OPT Employment Authorization

If you will graduate this Fall (December 2021), you can apply for OPT (Optional Practical Training) employment authorization in your field of study for up to 12 months. The first step is to apply for graduation (next column), and then submit the online form: [Optional Practical Training I-20 Request](#)

Class Registration

Spring 2022 class registration will begin in October. If you need to know your required classes for next semester, please submit the online advising request: [Pre-Advising Worksheet](#).

How to Stay in Lawful F-1 Visa Status

- You must report your Change of Address 10 days after you move. Fill out the [Change of Address Request](#).
- If you are planning to Change Majors, complete the [Change of Major Request](#) application.
- **Enroll full-time (12 credit hours) & attend classes to avoid being withdrawn by the professor for non-attendance.**
- You must maintain valid immigration documents (**Passport and I-20**) at ALL times.
- Employment must be on campus for 20 hours during the regular semester and full-time during summer break. Off-campus employment requires work authorization.

Do you plan to graduate this year? *Graduation does not happen automatically!* You must submit a graduation application before the applicable deadline:

Application Deadlines:

- Fall 2021- November 1

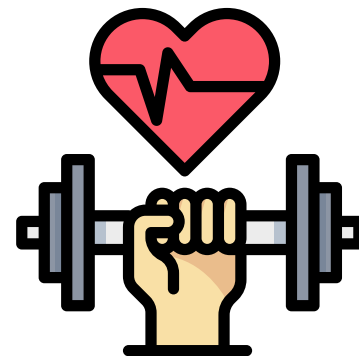

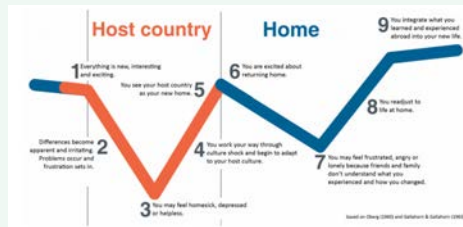

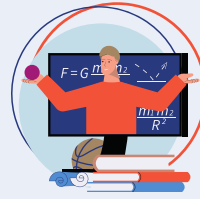

Arizona Legal Drinking Age is 21!



Arizona Underage Drinking Penalties

The legal drinking age in Arizona is 21. Arizona has strict laws addressing minors in possession (MIP) of alcohol and driving under the influence (DUI). Arizona law states that a person must be 21 to patronize a bar.

What are the penalties for breaking the laws? Minors can be charged with a misdemeanor for possessing (MIP) for:

- consuming alcohol
- illegally obtaining alcohol or gaining entrance to licensed alcohol establishments with a fake ID
- asking someone to purchase alcohol for them
- asking someone to sell or give them alcohol

Penalties for an MIP can include:

Class 1 Misdemeanors

- up to 6 months in a juvenile detention facility
- fined up to \$2,500
- up to 180-day driver's license suspension

Class 2 Misdemeanors

- up to 4 months in a juvenile detention facility
- fined up to \$750
- up to 180-day driver's license suspension

Class 3 Misdemeanors

- up to 30 days in a juvenile detention facility
- fined up to \$500
- up to 180-day driver's license suspension

Minors caught with a blood alcohol content level of .01 can be charged with a DUI. Considered a Class 1 Misdemeanor, minors could face any of the following penalties:

- 6 months in a juvenile detention facility
- \$2,500 fine
- 2 year suspension of driver's license
- installation of ignition interlock device on vehicle
- community service
- probation
- alcohol treatment program requirements

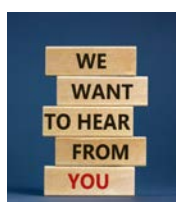
Tempe Town Lake
