Join us for a week-long adventure and introduction to Marine Biology where we explore the upper Sea of Cortez and bordering habitats around Puerto Peñasco. There will be many "hands-on" and "feet-in" experiences with marine organisms in their habitats, from sandy shores, and rocky tidepools to swimming near local islands. Come immerse yourself in the wonders of the sea!

Location

Puerto Peñasco, known to many North Americans as Rocky Point, is a small fishing village located on the upper Sea of Cortez or Gulf of California. Just over 60 miles from the U.S. border, it is often called Arizona's beach! It is also home to a sea lion breeding colony on Isla San Jorge.
