## New Bookstore Manager Joins MCC's Family



MCC's bookstore manager may be new to the Southern and Dobson campus, but she's a veteran when it comes to running bookstores. Jay Mueller's first experience in college bookstores dates back to age 15. She swept the floors at Chapman College in Orange, California, where her father was a professor.

One of Jay's top priorities at MCC is to establish a Bookstore Advisory Committee that would include several department chairs,

representatives from Administration and Student Services, and, of course, students. She has already submitted paperwork to establish the committee, and she hopes it will become a reality by January.

Jay values a sense of belonging and wants the Follett bookstore at MCC to be seen as part of the college community, not an outside business that happens to be located on campus. Jay takes advantage of every opportunity to prove the bookstore's eligibility for membership in MCC's "family."

"I think faculty and staff need to be more aware of what we can do for them-and what we already do," she said. For example, Jay and her staff attended the 4th Annual Student Services Retreat to stay current on student issues. "And a lot of people don't know that we give a percentage of everything we make back to the college," she said. Some of this money goes to support student scholarships.

Red Mountain's cyber café will be located directly below the library. Brian is



#### Bulk Mail 101

MCC's mailroom has changed its procedures for processing bulk mail to comply with new guidelines set forth by the United States Postal Service. To qualify for bulk mail rates, you must mail a minimum number of pieces. (Check the Post Office's website at www.usps.com for specifications.)

The text on the bulk mail imprint has changed and must be either pre-printed or stamped on the document. To borrow a rubber stamp with the correct information, contact Site Supervisor Todd Salvo at 461-7409.

Old Bulk Mail U.S Postage PAID Permit No.

New PRSRT STD U.S Postage PAID Permit No. 153

The sender must sort bulk mail items by the first three digits of the zip code before it is delivered to the mail room. Sorted items no longer have to be separated and rubber-banded; they can all be lumped together. Bulk mail that is not presorted will be assessed an additional fee for the mail room staff to do it.

The IKON mail center provides many services such as: stuffing and sealing of envelopes, affixing of labels (if provided), and copy service.
